VIDEO PROGRAM

The film *Mackinac Island of Renaissance* is shown continuously in the Video Room at the rear of the exhibit, near the Story Center.





See the construction of the buildings. Meet the people who gathered here from all over the world. Discover why Mackinac Island has long been a meeting place of peace and inspiration.


